## Participant Biographies



### **Susannah Baker**

Susannah Baker is one of the founders, a trustee, and the Refugee and Asylum Director for the Pickwell Foundation; Co-Chair of the Community Sponsorship Alliance-UK and an Advisor to the Home Office and DLUHC (department for levelling up) on the refugee Community Sponsorship scheme, the Homes for Ukraine Scheme and other Government routes to Resettlement. More recently the local work has expanded to include people seeking asylum, accommodated in a hotel.

The Pickwell Foundation, based in North Devon, is a grant-giving (and hands-on) trust working in the areas of the Climate emergency and displaced people. They are two families who, 15 years ago, wanted to explore a new way of living and working together, which continues until today.

Susannah has just been awarded an MBE for services to Ukraine.



### **Igor Bartkiv**

As the Ukraine Project Manager at the London Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Igor Bartkiv brings a business development, project management, and sales background. Currently, he focuses on providing multi-level support to Ukrainians in London, collaborating with diverse stakeholders ranging from local authorities to HMG, Ukrainian officials, and business associations. Igor facilitates connections and opportunities for individuals and businesses, fostering growth and success. With a proactive approach, strong interpersonal skills, and an extensive network, he is committed to upholding integrity, service, and excellence. His goal is to empower the Ukrainian community during these critical times and drive impactful initiatives.



### **Alexander Betts**

Alexander Betts is Professor of Forced Migration and International Affairs and Director of the Refugee Studies Centre, at the University of Oxford. His books include *The Wealth of Refugees: How Displaced People Can Build Economies* (Oxford University Press, 2021). His research mainly focuses on the political economy of refugee rights, with a focus on Africa and Europe. He has worked for UNHCR and as an advisor to a range of governments, businesses, and NGOs. His awards include the ESRC's Outstanding International Impact Award and the ISA's best book award in the Ethnicity, Nationalism, and Migration section. He has been recognised by Foreign Policy magazine as among the world's top-100 global thinkers. He recently began a new role as the University's Local and Global Engagement Officer.



### **Anna Dezyk (also known as Hanya informally)**

Anna Dezyk is an AUGB Board Director and currently serves as Deputy Chair. She administers the Help Ukraine Appeal raising over £3.5 million and is on the steering committee of the Ukrainian Welcome Centre, a joint venture refugee service. Anna has spoken about Ukrainian refugee needs on numerous panels including for the Public Policy Exchange, Migration Exchange, DLUHC Humanitarian TaskForce, Labour Friends of Ukraine and at Oxford University. She is a member of the DLUHC Core Delivery Group and also a governor of St. Mary's Ukrainian School. She had a long career as a senior director in Financial Investment research and has a degree in Geography from St. Hugh's College, Oxford University.



### **Stephen Doughty**

Stephen Doughty was elected as Welsh Labour & Co-operative Member of Parliament for Cardiff South and Penarth in a by-election in November 2012. He was re-elected in the General Elections of 2015, 2017 and 2019. Born and educated in Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan, he went on to study in Canada, Oxford and St Andrews, later working for the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly in Denmark, the National Assembly for Wales and then humanitarian NGOs World Vision UK, Oxfam, and as a special adviser on poverty, development, trade and humanitarian affairs to the then Secretary of State for International Development in the last Labour Government, Douglas Alexander.

Following the 2019 election, he was given the role of Shadow Foreign Affairs and International Development Minister, covering Africa initially, and is now Labour's Shadow Minister for Europe, North America and the Overseas Territories. He has previously held shadow ministerial and other roles in the Shadow Treasury, Business and Foreign Affairs teams, was also an Opposition Whip, and has served on the Wales, International Development and Home Affairs Select Committees.



### **Mike Gallagher**

Mike Gallagher is a Home Office civil servant serving as a middle manager and policy adviser in the Ukraine Strategic Response Team since February 2022, which is part of the Migration and Borders Group. Previous areas of work have been leadership of Country-of-Origin Information Service (COIS), lead on unaccompanied asylum-seeking children policies, Syrian resettlement, human rights and family migration, and child safeguarding. Outside work Mike enjoys walking, reading, watching sport and being with family and friends.



### **Michael Hastings**

Lord Dr Michael Hastings CBE is the Chairman of the University of London's School of Oriental and African Studies & the Professor of Leadership at the Huntsman Business School, USA ; he is a Governor of the MPESA Academy in Nairobi and a former Trustee of the Vodafone Group Foundation as well as being the former Global Head of Citizenship at KPMG and before the Head of Public Affairs at the BBC.

Lord Hastings is an Independent Member of the House of Lords – the Upper Chamber of the UK Parliament. As a former teacher, he is now a Director of the National Institute of Teaching and was the recent Chancellor of Regents University London. Lord Hastings is the President of UK Community Foundations and a Vice President of UNICEF.



### **Viktoriia Horbachevska**

Viktoriia Horbachevska is from the capital of Ukraine- Kyiv. Her two sons 14 and 9 years old accompanied her to the UK a year ago escaping from the war. Viktoriia's husband was mobilised as a doctor in April 2022.

Before the war she worked as an Administrative Director in The Union of Dairy Enterprises of Ukraine. She was a part of a team who launched the company in 2020 and dealt with all questions in the Union. She would deal with queries, administrative tasks, supported the HR team, accounting administration (office bills, members' bills, control income/ costs, calculation of the salary), organised meetings and events.

Before Viktoriia worked as a Data Analyst at Dairy production. She has experience in analytical and administrative support of the sales and marketing department. During her work, she developed her acquirements as high competence in working with Excel, maintaining databases, analysing data and providing conclusions.

Viktoriia is an experienced administrative manager looking to further her career. She is keen to enhance skills already gained, develop new skills and contribute to the success of a business.



### **Weston Hyde**

Weston Hyde is from Layton, Utah in United States. He earned his undergraduate degree in marketing from Utah State University and worked as a program coordinator at The Stephen R. Covey Leadership Center. At the Covey Center, he taught courses on The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People, empowering individuals to reach their full potential. He served as the chair of the Adoption and Special Guardianship Leadership Board where he brings strategic leadership to the finding of permanent loving families for children in the care system working across the sector and advising the English government.

Krish has led the charge on mobilising civil society groups and churches as they have supported recent arrivals from Hong Kong, Afghanistan, Ukraine and Sudan. He has helped to inspire and train thousands to care for vulnerable adults and children.

He is a regular broadcaster on the BBC and has written for publications as diverse as The Guardian, The Daily Express, The Spectator, The Times, The Sunday Times, Christianity Today and The Church Times.

### **Khrystyna Mukha**

Khrystyna Mukha is a 27-year-old architect. She was born in the city of Sambir, Ukraine, but for the past 25 years, she has lived in the Kharkiv region. She pursued her education in Architecture and Urban Planning at Kharkiv National University of Civil Engineering and Architecture, where she gained a strong foundation in her field.

Upon completing her master's degree, she worked as an architect and project coordinator, where she had the opportunity to contribute to various projects. One of her notable achievements was her involvement as a key team member on the Sarzhin Yar Park project. This project received nominations for the prestigious Architizer A+Awards and the Architecture MasterPrize in 2022.

In addition to her professional experience, she also dedicated three years to practising architecture and gained valuable expertise during her two-year tenure at the Private Institute «Kharkiv School of Architecture.» At the institute, she served as a tutor, coordinator of technical modules, and head of the academic department. This role allowed Khrystyna to share her knowledge and contribute to the growth and development of aspiring architects.

Eight months ago, due to the escalating war and destruction in her hometown caused by Russia, Khrystyna made the difficult decision to move to London. She wanted to continue her architectural practice and expand her skills in a safe and stable environment. Her goal is to gain new insights and experiences that she can eventually bring back to her home country to contribute to its rebuilding efforts.

Khrystyna aspires to return to Ukraine one day armed with the knowledge and skills she has acquired abroad and to play an active role in the reconstruction and development of her city and nation.

Nataliia Novokhatska is from Ukraine. She joined Diamond Light Source as the Engagement Coordinator in November 2022. It is the UK's national synchrotron science facility, located at the Harwell Science and Innovation Campus in Oxfordshire. She was a reviewer of a series of articles for the upcoming issue of Forced Migration Review, dedicated to refugees from Ukraine.



### **David Trickey**

David Trickey is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist who has specialised in working with traumatised children, young people and their families since 2000. He is Co-director of the UK Trauma Council which harnesses the expertise of the UK's leading child trauma experts to produce resources for those working with traumatised children and young people, as well as guidance and policy briefings based on the best available evidence.

As a clinician he continues to focus on direct clinical work and the training and supervision of other clinicians around the world working with traumatised children and young people. He presents at international conferences and supervises doctoral research. He acts as an expert witness in civil and criminal cases involving children and trauma, particularly those bereaved by family homicide. He was a member of the committee responsible for the 2018 revision of the NICE Guidelines for PTSD. In all his roles he draws heavily on and contributes to the published research literature.



### **Wincie Wong**

Wincie Wong uses her background at the leading edge of creative and disruptive innovation in the banking industry to break down barriers and transform the shape and diversity of the tech and data workforce. She is also co-host of the NatWest Technically Speaking podcast series discussing current topics in the evolving world of tech. She has a background working with the UK government to tap into the huge unrealised economic potential of female entrepreneurs by making the UK one of the best countries in the world for women to start and grow a new business as recommended in the Alison Rose Review of Female Entrepreneurship. A serial entrepreneur herself, she has been featured in Season 2 of BBC's My Million Pound Menu with host Fred Sirix for her business running Burmese supper clubs – now available on Netflix globally. In 2023, she was awarded Woman of the Year at the Women in IT Awards and was named one of the Top 100 Most Influential BAME Leaders in UK Tech by Inclusive Boards & the Financial Times in 2019. Having grown up in New York City, she's spent the last 14+ years across the pond in London where she is passionate about making innovation useful for customers.
